# **Local Property Tax Deadlines Changed**

Tazewell and Peoria treasurers and county boards have both taken action to give property tax payers an extension for the first installment of annual property taxes. Tazewell County has extended the deadline for the first payment until July 1 (from June 1). More <a href="here">here</a>. Peoria County will split the first installment in half with 50% being due on June 96 and the remaining amount due 60 days later on August 10. More here. #### **US Chamber of Commerce Advocating for More Assistance for Small Businesses**

U.S. Chamber sent a letter to all members of Congress urging them to increase funding for both the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) and the SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan program.
